
County of Los Angeles

Charge Evaluation

2.01.01 BASIC CRITERIA FOR CHARGING

A deputy may file criminal charges only if the following four requirements are satisfied:

- There is legally sufficient, admissible evidence of all of the elements of the crime(s) to be charged;
- There is legally sufficient, admissible evidence of the accused' (identity)s the perpetrator of the crime(s) to be charged;
- The deputy, based on a complete investigation and a thorough consideration of all
 pertinent facts readily available, is satisfied the evidence proves the accused is guilty of
 the crime(s) to be charged; and
- The deputy bea determined that the admissible evidence is of such convincing force that it would warrant conviction of the crime(s) charged by a reasonable and objective fact finder after hearing an the evidence available to the deputy at the time of charging and after considering the most plausible, reasonably foreseeable defense(s) inherent in the prosecution's evidence.

CA Penal Code § 17

- Defined by punishments
- Felony
- Misdemeanor
- Wobbler (can be either)
- Infraction

Misdemeanor Punishment

"Every other crime or public offense is a misdemeanor except those offenses that are classified as infractions."

- Penal Code § 17(a)

"Wobbler"

- Can be punished either by state prison or by county jail
- Maximum confinement as a misdm = 1 year in county jail

Wobbler

- PC § 487 Grand Theft
- PC § 245(a)(1), (a)(2), (a)(4) –
 Assault D/W
- VC § 23513 DUI with injury
- PC § 273.5 DV with injury
- PC § 530.5 identity theft

Declination Policy

- SD 20-13 (Dec 7, 2020)
- Charges shall not be filed:
 - PC 602, 415, 422, 647(f), 647(b-e), 653.22, 148(a)
 - VC 12500, VC 14601.1
 - HS 11350, 11357, 11364, HS 11377, 11550

Misdemeanor Courts

- Mostly all purpose courts
- 30 to 60 cases on calendar/day
- Arraignment, pre-trial, motions trials take place in same courtroom
- Assigned DAs/CPs and assigned PDs/APDs

Diversion Programs

- Successful = no conviction
- Pre-booking (LEA)
- Pre-filing (DA)
- Post-arraignment (DA)
- Post-conviction (DA)

Misdemeanor Case

- Arraignment: Diversion Offer
- Exceptions: 273.5, 243(e), 646.9, 290 registerable, DUI
- Pre-trial hearing/Motions
- Jury Trial Readiness
- Jury Trial

Misdemeanor Terms

- Classes AB 541, gun safety, DV, Anger Management, Parenting
- Community Service/Labor
- Restitution
- Criminal PO/Stay Away
- Maximum 1 year probation

Felony Courts

- More specialized courts
- Arraignment/EDP Courts
- Preliminary Hearing Courts
- Felony Calendar Courts
- Dedicated trial-only courts
- Cases move through each court

Felony Case

- Early Disposition/Pre-Preliminary Hearing/Bail Hearing
- Preliminary Hearing
- Superior Court Arraignment
- Pre-trial Hearings/Motions
- Jury Trial Readiness
- Jury Trial

Felony Terms

- Probation or Prison
 - SD 20-08 mandatory probation offer if probation eligible
- Probationary terms
 - -2 years max (some exceptions)
 - Community Service/Labor
 - Classes, programs, SAPO, restitution

Marsy's Law

- Marsy Ann Nichols, 21 yrs old
- USCB Student, stalked and murdered in 1983 by ex-boyfriend
- Defendant arrested and released on bail
- Nichols family not notified
- Became advocates for victim's rights

Marsy's Law

- Notice of of victim's rights
- Charges and court dates
- Present at court dates
- Notice of release, settlement, restitution
- Refuse to interview or set conditions

Bureau of Victim's Services

- Crisis intervention
- Emergency assistance
- Counseling referrals
- Case status notification
- Court escort and orientation
- Restitution assistance
